9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. **Workshop A – Drug & Alcohol Abuse – Signs, Symptoms & Prevention**

This training is designed to assist foster parents in recognizing the warning signs of addiction and substance abuse in the youth being served in their homes. Foster parents will be provided with insight into the warning signs of abuse, peer group influences, and the guidance that is effective in deterring substance abuse among the adolescent population. Information will be provided in regard to identifying the high risk situations that lend themselves to the abuse of substances as well as the role the foster parent can play in decreasing substance abuse. The foster parents will be provided with information in regard to addressing substance abuse, seeking out support and services, and resources available in all communities across the state of Pennsylvania. The members of the training will also be given the opportunity to ask questions and receive answers in regard to personal and particular concerns.
